TALK ON DR. EDITH WALLACE

Dr. Edith Wallace: Life, Work, and Legacy

Southwestern College, Santa Fe, New Mexico

This talk will describe the work and life of Dr. Edith Wallace, who was a Jungian Analyst, artist and Seeker. Dr. Wallace's interest in the creative process and her focus on finding one's own inner wisdom were the guiding lights on her journey. Her journey was an inspiration that helped many others find their path.

Dr. Wallace began practicing Jungian analysis in 1951 after she finished her Jungian training in New York and also in Zurich with Mrs. Emma Jung and C.G. Jung. She developed her Collage Method utilizing Active Imagination in the 1970s and taught workshops around the world up until her death in 2004.

Dr. Wallace came into contact with many spiritual ways, mostly of the Sufi lines, but also Native American Shamanism and western esotericism which was woven into her work. Her Collage Method fused imagery and narrative together, and she never lost sight of the wonders of fairy tales from around the world.

Images, Metaphor and Myth: a one-day exploration into the untamed frontiers of the imagination

The Collage Process, developed by Dr. Edith Wallace, calls attention to the living space of the imagination as an active and vital healing tool. There is an inner peace that arises from this process as a new channel of information opens to guide you on your life pilgrimage. This manner of expression supports the symbolic language arising between the conscious and unconscious parts of ourselves and utilizes Jung's active imagination in a unique way. On this workshop we will create collages, engage in somatic exercises and explore how the story of our inner landscape informs our lives. This reflective process awakens the instinctual and primitive parts of the brain, allowing deep interior truths to emerge.
